

Wyoming Migrant Health Project

Fact Sheet-- To improve the health status of migrant and seasonal farm workers and their families through the assurance of high-quality primary and preventive health care services.

A total of 89 migrant and seasonal farm workers and their families attended the Powell Migrant Health Fair in June with 57 attending the Worland Migrant Health Fair in June as well.

The federally funded Migrant Health Project, administered through the Wyoming Health Council, provides services in Park, Washakie, Big Horn and Fremont Counties

- ✓ A program wherein the entire family is included in the service delivery system

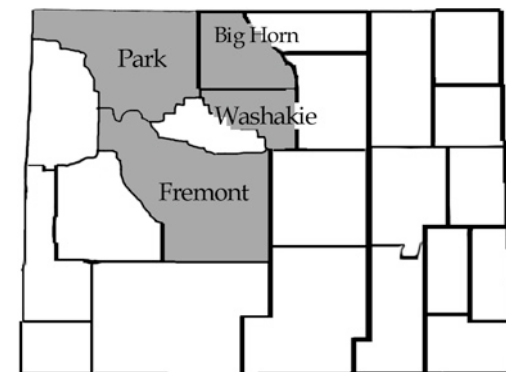
The Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Health Project is NOT:
